1.1 KEEPERS OF THE FLAME-BOOK DONATION CAMPAIGN

1.4. VISITED MARIASADANAM, A RESIDENCE FOR MENTALLY CHALLENGED INDIVIDUALS

On October 19, 2022, a group comprising 40 NSS volunteers, along with Program Officers Dr. Simimol Sebastian and Dr. Mariamma Mathew, and Volunteer Secretaries Ms. Keerthana Reji and Ms. Gourikrishna S., visited Mariasadanam, a residence for mentally challenged individuals. This charitable institution provides care for approximately 475 men and women, typically ranging in age from 19 to 82 years. In an effort to alleviate the routine of their lives, the volunteers engaged with the residents, presented a cultural program, and contributed a donation of Rs. 6,500 to support their well-being.

1.6. OTHER CHARITY INITIATIVES

- On September 2, 2022, a collection of both old and new clothing from students and teachers was gathered and subsequently distributed to the residents of Mariasadhan.
- On October 25, 2022, a collection of dresses from the Mannar parish found a meaningful purpose as shirts and dhotis when donated to the residents of 'Anandabhavan' in Chethimattam, Pala. This home for aged men, managed by the Sehagiri sisters, currently accommodates 55 inhabitants.
- On November 2, 2022, the NSS unit demonstrated its generosity by donating dresses to the children living in 'Girl Town,' Kozhuvanal. The beneficiaries of this kind gesture were 72 orphans who are under the guardianship of the Snehagiri sisters, the dedicated individuals overseeing the operations of the orphanage. Also, donated sarees to the inmates of "Jubilee Bhavan" at Chethimattam, Pala on 12th November 2022. 34 aged women are there.
- On the 8th of November 2022, a contribution of shirts and trousers was extended to the youngsters at "Boys' Town" located in Karoor. This donation specifically benefited 103 boys hailing from economically disadvantaged families. Also, donated a wheelchair to 'Mariasadan', a charitable organization at Pala on 13th November 2022.
- On November 13, 2022, a wheelchair was generously given to 'Mariasadan,' a charitable organization based in Pala. These acts of kindness reflect a commitment to supporting various communities and organizations in need.
- On November 12, 2022, sarees were donated to the 34 elderly women at "Jubilee Bhavan" in Chethimattam, Pala.
- As part of International Women's Day the NCC sub unit sponsored an orphan girl child taking care of her educational and medical needs.


1.7. EXHIBITION ON "PRO-LIFE"- 22nd FEBRUARY 2023



2.7.1 "PARYAPTHA 2023" PROMOTING ECO-FRIENDLY SELF RELIANCE

The Centre organized *Paryaptha 2023*, an exhibition cum sale of handmade items by students and teachers on 10 January 2023 with the objective of inculcating the ideals of self-reliance, women empowerment, and sustainable development among students. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Sr. Regeenamma Joseph, Principal, Alphonsa College. Traditional food items, handicrafts, bags, jewelry, clothing, towels, organic fruits and vegetables, recycled art items, homemade detergents, etc. were on sale. 




2.7.2. OTHER ACTIVITIES TO BUILD ENVIRONMENTAL CONSCIOUSNESS

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


independence. Here are some ways Independence Day celebrations can contribute to the development of responsible citizenship:


3.2.2 Poster making competition on 11.08.2022


Independence Day celebration- Dance performance featuring traditional dance forms from various states in India




As part of the Independence Day festivities on August 15, 2022, the Physics Department arranged various contests, including the Tricolour Selfie Contest and Food Plating competitions.





Our II DC student English Anakha Raju won second place and a cash prize of five lakhs in the national level Deshbhakti Geet Writing Competition.










3.4 NATIONAL UNITY DAY








3.5 COMMEMORATING THE HIROSHIMA NAGASAKI DAY

A photo exhibition of Mahatma Gandhi as well as posters depicting his philosophy was held on 30 January to commemorate 75 years of his martyrdom.










3.6. WORLD POPULATION DAY






Taking Voters Day Pledge on January 26, 2023




7. ANTI-DRUG WEEK CELEBRATIONS




Anti-drug awareness rally on 30th September 2022






7.8 FLASH MOB FOR A DRUG FREE WORLD ON 1 NOVEMBER 2022






8. ACTIVITES TO INCULCULCATE GANDHIAN VALUES






8.5 INVITED LECTURE ON 'GANDHI: A CONTEMPORARY READING' ON 14 JANUARY 2023

An invited lecture on the theme 'Gandhi: A Contemporary Reading' was organised by the Centre on 14 January 2023. Dr. Sunil P.Elayidom, Professor, Sree Sankaracharya University of Sanskrit, recipient of the Kerala Lalithkala Akademi Kesari Award and two time recipient of the Kerala Sahitya Akademi Award, was the resource person and the session was chaired by Dr. K.M.Seethi, ICSSR Senior Fellow, Mahatma Gandhi University.
