

# **CENTRE FOR GANDHIAN STUDIES**

# **NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)**

The NSS unit of Alphonsa College has the strength of 200 highly motivated volunteers and two dedicated Programme Officers. The unit with the motto "Not Me, But Thou", had a productive year during 2018-2019. The volunteers actively engaged in reconstructing Kerala after the fatal flood the state faced in August 2018. Since then, the unit has focused on the task of making Kerala as neat and beautiful as it was. The seven day NSS camp was conducted in the flood affected ward V of Mutholy Panchayat and along with the struggle to rebuild Kerala, the unit was dedicated to the personal growth of every volunteer. Classes and awareness programmes on different issues an individual might face in the future days were imparted to the volunteers and they were given opportunities to share it with the community.

The unit officially started its activities for the academic year 2018-19 by observing World Environment Day by organizing a talk on "Plastic Pollution" by Shri. Ajay Jose, Co-ordinator, Shuchithva Mission, Pala Municipality on 5 June 2018. The unit distributed vegetable seeds among the houses in Pala municipality. Also, a One Day State Level seminar on "Causes, Effects and Solutions of Plastic Pollution" was organized on 20 June with the support of KSCSTE. Dr. Punnen Kurian, Principal, St. Mary's College Manarcad, Prof. Claramma Jacob and Dr. Raju D Krishnapuram led various sessions. A signature campaign that calls for a clean, zero-waste area, was organized jointly with Pala Municipality and an exhibition cum competition on the craft materials made out of used plastic also was conducted in connection with the seminar. The NSS Unit inaugurated the mission of planting jackfruit trees by planting one jackfruit tree in the campus and 100 more jackfruit trees, mostly at the house of the volunteers. Ms. Mary Dominic, Municipal Councillor, Pala and Dr. Sr. Therese Madukkakkuzhy jointly inaugurated the programme.

#### Camps

Three Days' Mini Camp was conducted on the theme "Cleanliness and Self Defense", as every girl should practice these in their lives. A half day was dedicated to campus cleaning.

The special camp was held at the flood affected ward 5, Mutholy on the theme "Green Village, Clean Village". The camp was inaugurated by Sri KM Mani MLA. Classes on "Waste Disposal and

LED bulbs, paper carry bags and paper pens were made and distributed in the community by the volunteers and seeds and plant saplings were supplied to the village community. Surveys and awareness programmes on waste disposal methods were conducted. Plastic waste was collected from the houses and Meenachil river and was handed over to the Haritha Karma Sena.

#### Report of Flood Relief Activities

Our unit has collected and distributed food and dress materials for the affected people in Mutholy Panchayat on 24 July 2018 after the first flood. Twenty five volunteers cleaned the road using bleaching powder from Kottaramattom bus stand to the College. Our unit offered a helping hand to the affected people in Kuttanadu and Kumarakom by collecting two loads of food and cloth materials and provided to the distribution points. Our team of two hundred volunteers offered their selfless service in collecting, sorting and packing the materials on that day. Twenty of our volunteers participated in the massive cleaning programme organized by Shuchithva Mission at Vaikom municipality on 27 August 2017. Ten of our volunteers copied notes for the students of flood affected areas. One hundred and fifty volunteers of our unit participated in collecting plastic waste that accumulated after the flood. Further note books and other study materials were provided to the students who lost it in the flood.


#### VALUE EDUCATION 2018-19
