

The Centre for Gandhian Studies of Alphonsa College, established in July 2008, continued its

covers diverse themes that are relevant to the ideas and philosophy of Mahatma Gandhi. Besides


books written on and by Gandhi the collection includes books on Indian history, polity and society,

INVITED LECTURE ON 'GANDHI AND POSTCOLONIAL THOUGHT'

An invited lecture on 'Gandhi and Postcolonial Thought' was organised by the Centre on 5 January 2023. The resource person for the programme was Dr. Mathew Joseph C. Professor, MMAJ Academy of International Studies, Jamia Milia Islamia, New Delhi. In the overall framework of the theoretical notions of postcolonialism and Eurocentrism, Dr. Joseph put forth his arguments as to why Mahatma Gandhi needs to be taken into account as one of the first postcolonial thinkers and how he differed from

other early postcolonial thinkers.



Gandhian principles as he spoke on Gandhi's views on modern civilization (which shifted focus from nature to natural resources, from human beings to citizens, from people to population, from knowledge to expertise); Gandhi's views on nationalism, and on religion. Providing a detailed account of the intricacies of Gandhi's last days, he emphasised the importance that Gandhi gave to the discovery of truth, even if it was at the cost of being inconsistent.

TALK AND DISTRIBUTION OF BOOKLETS AGAINST ALCOHOLISM IN PALA SUB JAIL



The Centre organized Paryaptha

2023, an exhibition cum sale of handmade items by students and teachers on 10 January 2023 with the objective of inculcating the ideals of self-reliance, women empowerment and sustainable development among students. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. Sr. Regeenamma Joseph, Principal, Alphonsa College. Traditional food items, handicrafts, bags, jewellery, clothing, towels, organic fruits and vegetables, recycled art items, homemade detergents, etc. were on sale. As in the previous year, the focus on organizing an exhibition with 'zero waste' was a



prime objective. Items like plastic bags, disposable plates, cups and spoons, tissue papers and paper posters were prohibited.
