

ANNUAL REPORT 2018-2019

As India stepped into the twenty-first century, it confronted a myriad of fresh challenges, necessitating robust solutions to fortify the nation's resilience. Recognizing the pivotal role of its burgeoning young populace in steering the country towards future prosperity, India strategically harnessed institutions like the National Cadet Corps (NCC) as crucial instruments for national advancement.

The genesis of the NCC can be traced back to the University Corps, established under the Indian Defense Act of 1917. Initially conceived to address manpower shortages in the Armed Forces, it underwent several iterations before formalizing as the National Cadet Corps in 1948 under the NCC Act XXXI of 1948, operating under the Ministry of Defence. This transition was facilitated by a committee led by Pandit H. N. Kunzru, convened in 1964 at the direction of Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru.

Initially confined to university students, the NCC gradually broadened its purview to encompass school and college students. Despite modest beginnings, with aims to enlist 32,500 Senior Division and 135,000 Junior Division cadets, its current sanctioned strength stands at 4.33 lakhs for senior division and 7.30 lakhs for junior division cadets. While this represents only 3.8% of the eligible student population, the NCC has evolved into a mature and esteemed organization, nurturing the youth within its ranks.

Over time, the activities of the NCC have diversified significantly beyond its initial emphasis on drill and weapon training. It now encompasses a wide array of pursuits including games, sports, and various skill-building exercises. Training modules have expanded to encompass disciplines such as drill, firing, map reading, and first aid, with camp training emerging as a cornerstone of the program. Additionally, community development activities play a vital role in fostering awareness and empathy among youth. These initiatives range from blood donation drives and adult literacy programs to skill development initiatives and participation in national campaigns such as the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.

In essence, the National Cadet Corps has burgeoned into a multifaceted organization that not only imparts military training but also instills values of discipline, patriotism, and social responsibility among India's youth. Its role in shaping well-rounded citizens and contributing to national development remains pivotal in India's journey towards progress and prosperity.
