NATIONAL CADET CORPS 2021-2022

As we entered the twenty-first century, India encountered new challenges demanding robust solutions. To bolster the nation's strength, it became imperative for India to equip itself, and the National Cadet Corps emerged as a pivotal tool. The future prosperity of any nation hinges significantly on its youthful human resources. The inception of the National Cadet Corps was a result of India's foresight to cultivate an organized, disciplined, educated, and patriotic populace.

The roots of the National Cadet Corps trace back to the University Corps established under the Indian Defense Act of 1917. Initially conceived to address the shortfall in the Armed Forces, it evolved through various iterations, eventually becoming the National Cadet Corps in 1948 under the NCC Act XXXI of 1948, operating under the Ministry of Defence. This transition was catalyzed by a committee led by Pandit H. N. Kunzru, formed in 1964 at the directive of Prime Minister Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru.

The NCC, originally limited to university students, later expanded its reach to encompass school and college students. Commencing with modest goals, the corps aimed to recruit 32,500 Senior Division and 135,000 Junior Division cadets. Presently, the sanctioned strength stands at 4.33 lakhs for senior division and 7.30 lakhs for junior division cadets. Although substantial, this represents only 3.8% of the eligible student population, yet the NCC has evolved into a mature and esteemed organization, nurturing the youth within its ranks.

Over time, the activities of the NCC have diversified significantly. Initially focused on drill and weapon training, the spectrum has broadened to encompass games, sports, and various skill-building exercises. Training now includes disciplines such as drill, firing, map reading, and first aid, with camp training being a cornerstone. Community development

activities, aimed at fostering awareness and empathy among youth, form an integral part of NCC endeavors. These encompass initiatives like blood donation, adult literacy drives, skill development programmes and participation in the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, among others.

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

Alphonsa College Pala NCC has a strength of 108 cadets and an Officer. 30 cadets were enrolled this year.









AUDIO BOOKS






INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY





3. International Day Against Child Labour was observed on 12 June 2021 by making posters and documentaries on the theme "Act Now: End Child Labour".







Cadets performed Yoga . As part of the IYD training in Yoga was also given to the caets.70 cadets participated.







