

The Centre for Gandhian Studies of Alphonsa College, established in July 2008, continued its efforts to promote an understanding of Mahatma Gandhi and inculcate the values and ideals that he stood for during the year 2023-2024. The Centre was able to organise several programmes based on different aspects of Gandhian thought and values.

GANDHI FORUM






Origami workshop for NSS Volunteers of St. Thomas School, Pala











Sound of Silence


PRAYAANA 2K23: A JOURNEY THROUGH THE LIFE OF MAHATMA
