








4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 249 responses






5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers. 249 responses




6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you? 249 responses










9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow. 249 responses










11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you. 246 responses








13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.










17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 249 responses


